Newsletters

Several parents at PVG raised concerns about the costs for the school and environmental impact of printing the weekly newsletter. We have agreed that from half term, fortnightly newsletters will be sent out by e-mail only. Please ensure that the office has an up to date e-mail address for you.

PVG Feedback on Future School Productions

We all agreed that Wind in the Willows was a wonderful production and that the children benefitted enormously from participating in the production. However, we agreed that it was very long and that it is very difficult for children and teachers to have such late nights at school in the run up to Christmas. The production did have a significant impact on learning and progress at school.

So, from next year (2018-2019) we will have a different structure to school performances. Lantic and perhaps Y1 will perform their nativity at Christmas. There will then be another school production in July, perhaps with separate performances for KS1 and KS2 so that there are more opportunities for more children to play bigger roles.

We will also be looking at moving the July production to a bigger performance space on a Friday night, ideally in Fowey but if not in a theatre/hall space in St Austell or Bodmin so that more families are able to get tickets and children are not so tired the next day.

Lots more details will follow next year.

Morning Drop Off

Parents at PVG have raised concerns about the safety of the current morning arrangements at school, which I share. Under the current system, there are many adults in and around the school building in the morning and it is difficult to establish when the children are the responsibility of the class teacher. This increases the risk of a child wandering off and not being spotted and also means that adults, who are not necessarily parents, have access to children who are not their own.

To reduce this risk, we have agreed that from half term all children will be dropped at their external classroom door between 8:30 and 8:40. The bell will go at 8:45 and children who are not in class by this time will be marked as late. Cloakroom doors will no longer be used in the mornings. Children will be welcomed by their teacher and will come into the building, by themselves, to hang up their coats and bags. There will still be an opportunity for parents to talk to the teacher at the door, each morning and afternoon, should you need to pass on any messages or discuss any concerns. Teachers can always meet parents after school if you need a more confidential conversation.

We will be working with the children over the next few weeks to prepare for this. We believe this is a great opportunity to promote independence and responsibility for our children.
