English

Pupils will read traditional stories from Commonwealth countries. They will read and write fables in the style of a 'Porquoi' story.

They will also write letters to other children in the Commonwealth and create a 'Charter for a Commonwealth Child'. In grammar and word work, they will experiment with the different types of subordinate clause, and distinguish between commonly misspelt verb/noun pairs e.g. practise and practice.

Art

Pupils will learn about stamp designers and how stamps are created. They will improve their observational drawings and water colour skills.

Science

Pupil will link their SRE work, considering human life cycles and drawing comparisons with other animals.

They will also answer questions using evidence gathered from different types of scientific enquiry.

Music

Pupils will research and sing the Jubilee song 'Sing'. They will learn about the structure of pop songs.

French

Who, what, when, where and why?
Pupils will learn about question words.
They will also learn about the French
Canadian athletes who have competed at
the Commonwealth Games.

RE

Cornwall as a place of Christianity
Pupils will develop their understanding of
why people feel attracted to Cornwall as
a centre of spiritualilty.

Computing

Pupils will learn about 3D modelling and how 3D printers create physical things. They will gain knowledge through Google SketchUp and create their own 3D model.

Geography

Pupils will name and locate the countries of the Commonwealth. They will learn about which products these countries export and the importance of global trade.

PSHE/SRE

Pupils will discuss how to cope with change e.g. moving onto a new class, and how friendships evolve. They will also consider physical and emotional changes to our bodies through puberty. They will be attending a Junior Life Skills session at St Austell Fire Station.

History

Pupils will explore the origins of the British Empire and why it is such a controversial period of British history. They will explain the creation of the Commonwealth at the end of the British Empire.

They will also study the origins of the Commonwealth games and research traditional games from Commonwealth countries.

PE

In striking and fielding sessions, children will learn about different styles of bowling in Rounders. They will also develop their tactical awareness when batting and fielding. In Athletics, children will develop their running style, comparing techniques when running for speed or distance.

Maths

Pupils will recall and apply their knowledge about the properties of numbers using key terminology: factor, multiple, square, cube and prime numbers. They will find perimeters and areas of 2D shapes and volumes of cubes and cuboids. They will handle and interpret data in different contexts including converting currencies. They will also revisit recording Roman numerals to 1000 and apply this to number puzzles.
