Music Lessons

First Aid Reporting

We have to report any incidents to Cornwall Council which happened at school and result in a child going to hospital (e.g. if you take your child to Penrice after school to have a bumped head checked). At Fowey, such accidents are very rare but please do let the Office know if you have to do this, so we can make sure it's correctly reported.

First Aid Letters

Alongside the other schools in Peninsula Learning Trust, we are introducing new accident/incident forms. This is to ensure that the school is compliant with regulations around the recording of incidents. Under this new system, a small, white form will be sent home with your child every time they have any kind of first aid. It is the same form for any first aid incident so bumped heads will be on the same form as a grazed knee, for instance. Please bear in mind that just because you have received a form, doesn't mean the incident has been serious and some children (who are more accident prone) may receive many forms as we have to send you one every time we do first aid, even if this is just to apply an ice pack.
