Lantic have enjoyed starting their class text The Enormous Turnip. They made a story map to help them remember the key events.

Mila made a great effort with her map and enjoyed acting out the story in class using the puppets. The children are looking forward to planting some of our own seeds and growing enormous vegetables, just like the turnip!



This week Cannis class have been learning continents of the world and how to travel using different modes of transport. The children really enjoyed looking at different modes of transport and how this has changed over time. They also enjoyed a sensory walk looking for signs of spring.



In maths, Year 2 have been learning about 2D and 3D shapes and have applied their knowledge and understanding of properties of shape to accurately create 2D shapes. First, the children enjoyed using geo-boards to make shapes with elastic bands and looked carefully at the number of sides and vertices. The children then drew their own shapes on squared paper. They have worked hard trying to draw accurately using a ruler, which can be a tricky skill to

Pupils have shown enquiring minds, and produced work on the Maya including planning masks, generating questions and learning about where they lived and key events. There has also been excellent work in science discovering where electricity comes from, creating electrical circuits and identifying electrical hazards.



Year 5 have welcomed a CELT specialist science teacher who is working with them this half term every Monday afternoon. They have enjoyed learning gravity and forces with practical experiments. They have very much enjoyed designing, conducting and reviewing their own scientific enquiries.
