
Car Park



Camp Meeting

A letter will go out today to Year 6 and Year 5 parents regarding next year's camp. We are very excited to announce that this will be a watersports camp on the Isle of Wight (our first adventure via ferry!)

Mr Trudgeon and Miss Barnes will hold an initial information session for all Y5/Y6 parents on Wednesday 9th October straight after school. Please do come along and find out more! As last year, residential trips are an integral part of our school curriculum and we do expect all children to attend. If this is problematic for you financially, please do come and have a very confidential conversation with us and we will do everything we can to support.

Doodle Maths

Today we launch our new online maths platform, Doodle Maths which we trialled in some year groups last year. Your child will bring home their own personalised log in today and will already have begun to access the system at school.

Doodle Maths is cloud based so you can access it via any internet enabled device or you can download an app. There is also a parent portal which you can use to view your child's progress.

The app comes with a social messaging function where children can send messages to each other, securely within Doodle Maths. There is no facility for them to contact anyone outside of our school. For the time being, we have switched this off. We have been told that it is a great way of getting children to engage with the app and therefore do their maths but we feel that we need to know the system much better if/when we are to use this function.

Doodle Maths will work best for your child if they access it very regularly for short bursts. Ideally your child should log on and do about ten minutes every day. As a minimum, children must be accessing Doodle Maths at home three times a week. The system will send statistics directly to teachers so we will be able to monitor this from school.

Once the system is embedded, teachers will begin to set specific homework tasks using it. This learning will appear first when your child logs in and they won't be able to do anything else within the system until they have completed this.

Before this can happen, the system needs to calibrate to your child's specific maths level. It will do this by setting them a range of tasks and assessing where their strengths and weaknesses are. Initially, this will mean your child won't have full functionality of the site but the more you use it the quicker your child will finish this process. We will recalibrate all children termly so that we ensure they are always working at the right level.

We hope that you really enjoy using Doodle Maths and that it will allow you to work much more closely with your child at home on their maths. Please remember, however, that it is a learning system so it's very important that you allow your child to make mistakes if they are finding something difficult. If you do an activity 'for' your child, it will think they can do that independently and it won't offer them any more activities of that kind- meaning your child won't fill that gap... it will also move them up to the next level of maths in that area, which your child may not be ready for.
