Class Contributions

In the last fortnight, your children have had:

Polperro Fisherman's Choir (which Mrs Bryant brilliantly arranged for free!)

African Drumming Workshops (all classes except Year 3 and 4) which cost £400 for the day

Trip to St Austell Cinema (Lantic, Cannis and Gribben) which cost £5.50 per child (so £385) and £350 for the coach transport.

Attendance

We are very pleased to have seen a significant improvement in attendance this year. Thank-you to everyone who makes such an effort to ensure their children are at school on time every day.

Just a reminder, Cornwall Council does issue fixed penalty fines to anyone taking children out of school for an unauthorised holiday. Penalty notices are issued for each child and are £60 per child if paid within 21 days, increasing to £120 if paid after 21 days. A penalty notice which is unpaid after 28 days is automatically referred for court proceedings, which can result in a fine of up to £2500.

Absence for holidays cannot be authorised and we have to unauthorise absence if children tell us that they have been on holiday, when they have been reported to school as being unwell.

Once any child has accrued 10 sessions (5 days) of unauthorised absence we cannot authorise any absence for illness without medical evidence.

PE Trainers

A reminder that children need to have a change of trainers for PE and should not be doing PE in their school shoes.

Sports Day

Early next week you will receive a personalised paper letter regarding sports day, which will be held at our school this year (not at FRA). It is the 2nd July (which is the first day back after the inset day) so please don't forget your child's PE kit! We will send all PE kits home on Friday ready for washing, so we look our very best!

Project Based Learning Feedback

Thank-you to the 21 families who have given us feedback on Project based learning. We are delighted to see that the overwhelming majority (all except one) feel their child is learning much more in this way with many of us (me included) taught a great deal by the children about their project areas. We are also really pleased to see that parental engagement has been really high with 76% of families having attended at least one project based event with their children this year.

81% of families felt that we should continue offering the same amount of trips and in-school special activities with the remaining families feeling we should offer even more!

Everyone who responded said that they were happy to continue with class contributions to fund this with the majority of parents 66% saying they prefer to pay this as a 'lump sum' as we currently do. However, a sizable number (a third) of parents who responded said they would prefer to pay for each thing individually and we have seen a significant fall in the number of parents who contribute since we have started putting it into one class contribution. To help with this, we will return to asking parents to contribute individually for each specific thing next year. This is more work for teachers and the office staff but we are concerned that if contributions do not increase significantly we will need to reduce trips which no-one wanted.

Some of the comments made by families were:


It's fun and enjoyable!
