We are delighted to introduce Jack Maddern who has joined the Fowey team. Mr Maddern will be teaching the children PE and supporting positive playtimes and lunchtimes. Mr Maddern will also be providing a range of sports clubs after school each night. More details will be shared tomorrow including booking details.

Our School Uniform (Full details can be found on our website):

- Fowey jumper/cardigan
- White polo shirt
- Black trousers/skirt/pinafore dress (this academic year grey is allowed)
- Black socks + Black School Shoes (no trainers)
- Smart hair style of natural colour and no extreme styles. Hair that is long must be tied up.
- PE kit House colour t-shirt, blue shorts, trainers. (To be kept in school every day)
- Watches may be worn and small stud earrings, however, no jewellery is allowed when doing PE.

The PE tops are now meant to be in the child's house colour, if you require any support with purchasing these or other elements of the school uniform, please contact the school office.

What my child needs to bring to school every day:

All children will need to bring a refillable water bottle to school. Juniors (Year 3+) will also need to bring a piece of fruit for snack time. Infant children all receive free fruit under the School Fruit and Veg Scheme. Stationery is provided by the school so children do not need to bring pens/pencil cases.

School Dinners: We acknowledge there was a fault with ParentPay over the weekend, however, this has now been rectified.

School meals must be ordered in advance through **ParentPay**. This enables our morning registration process to be streamlined and our catering provider to reduce food waste. Please note, all children must book their meal through ParentPay, even children in receipt of Free School Meals and Universal Infant Free School Meals. School meals will need to be booked by midnight on the Sunday for the week ahead. For example, meals for the week commencing Monday 12th September, will need to be made by midnight on Sunday 11th September.

Starting from this term, Cornwall Education Learning Trust have made the decision to provide ALL infant pupils with a school lunch. We are encouraging all children in EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2 to take up their free meal. We are asking parents not to send their child (Years R, 1 & 2) to school with a packed lunch. The School Office will order your child the 'main' option if a meal is not selected for them. Parents are welcome to supplement their child's school dinner with a packed lunch if they wish, however, children will be encouraged to sample their hot meal before their packed lunch. Our catering company are able to cater for a wide variety of dietary needs so please do come and speak to us if you have any questions regarding our menu. (The menu is available to view on ParentPay and our website).

If your child has not previously been entitled to free school meals and your circumstances have changed, please speak to our School Office.

Oceans Wraparound: Mrs Calloway runs our Oceans Wraparound Club. Breakfast club opens at 7:50am, and After School Club runs until 5:00pm. Any questions please do speak to the school office or email admin@foweysch.org. All bookings must be paid prior to your child attending.

Drop Off and Pick Up: All children are expected to arrive at school at 8:35am. The gates open at 3:05pm to collect your child. Finally, if you have any questions in the meantime, please do not hesitate to contact us.











The new reception class have all settled really well into their new class.




